Description of Position: This position will begin with the 2021-2022 school year. The teacher will be responsible for working with behavioral students who exhibit a wide range of characteristics, including but not limited to aggressive behaviors, attention deficit hyperactivity and an inability to relate to others or social situations. A strong working knowledge of behavioral strategies and interventions is necessary as well as a solid understanding of positive support systems to maximize student success. Some students may be very involved. May be called upon to restrain and/or de-escalate students. Supervision of one or more paraeducator(s) is required.

Minimum Competencies Required:

- Experience in teaching EBD students preferred
- Washington State Teaching Certificate with endorsement in special education
- Able to administer and interpret assessments related to student performance
- Able to write effective IEP's for eligible special education children
- Able to communicate well with parents, students, and staff
- Familiar with state and federal special education laws, i.e. IEP's, assessment & evaluation
- Able to work with people; a team player
- Able to provide specially designed instruction to meet unique needs, abilities, and limitations of identified students, including design and maintenance of Behavioral Intervention Plans
- Consult with classroom teachers and provide intervention strategies to facilitate mainstream experiences
- Ability to develop programs and work with difficult EBD children
- Evidence of, or willingness to acquire, training in Right Response or other aversive interventions and restraint

Desired Qualification:

- Broad based depth and breadth of experience/training with behaviorally challenged students, including other handicapping conditions that may also be manifested in student behavior
- Experience/training working with students diagnosed on the Autism spectrum
- Experience, training, commitment to assisting regular education staff in embracing an inclusive model of intervention whenever appropriate
- Knowledge, training, and/or experience with laws, rules and regulations pertaining to special education discipline
- Knowledge, training and/or experience with positive behavior interventions and strategies
