Dear Parent or Guardian:

We are so excited to welcome back our LHS students. We cannot wait to see them walk through those doors on March 29th!

We will be returning in a hybrid model, which means we will see half of our students on Monday and Tuesday (A days) and the other half on Thursday and Friday (B days). Each student has their indicator labeled in Skyward, under bussing, based on geographic location.

Your child is an A day student. Which means:

- They will be attending on Mondays and Tuesdays, starting on March 29th.
- On Wednesdays, they will be zooming into their 1st, 2nd, and 3rd period classes one week for 30 minutes each and alternating with 4th, 5th, and 6th period the next week. We will begin with 4th, 5th, and 6th on March 31st to keep in line with the middle school schedule.
- Teachers will also have office hours from 11:45 am – 12:30 pm on Wednesdays.
- On Thursdays and Fridays, starting April 15th, your child will zoom into their classes for about 10-15 minutes each. This allows the teacher to share the agenda for the day, take attendance and answer any questions they may have. The remainder of the time will be for your child to work independently.

The block schedule is included for your convenience and is also posted on our website. This also includes the lunch schedule, which is based on your child's second period teacher on Monday and 5th period teacher on Tuesday. LHS is a closed campus, meaning students are not allowed to leave during lunch. For the remainder of the school year, food deliveries will not be allowed. Breakfast and lunch are available to all students free of charge.

We have also included a safety protocol document that outlines what the day looks like for your child; starting with entry into the building with their attestation slips (also included), transitions, lunchtime, and end of day dismissal. Please read this document and review it with your child.

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Your child is a B day student. Which means:

- They will be attending in-person on Thursdays and Fridays, starting on April 1st.
- On Wednesdays, they will be zooming into their 1st, 2nd, and 3rd period classes one week for 30 minutes each and alternating with 4th, 5th, and 6th period the next week. We will begin with 4th, 5th, and 6th on March 31st to keep in line with the middle school schedule.
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- On Mondays and Tuesdays, starting April 12th, your child will zoom into their classes for about 10-15 minutes each. This allows the teacher to share the agenda for the day, take attendance and answer any questions they may have. The remainder of the time will be for your child to work independently.

The block schedule is included for your convenience and is also posted on our website. This also includes the lunch schedule, which is based on your child's second period teacher on Thursday and 5th period teacher on Friday. LHS is a closed campus, meaning students are not allowed to leave during lunch. For the remainder of the school year, food deliveries will not be allowed. Breakfast and lunch are available to all students free of charge.

We have also included a safety protocol document that outlines what the day looks like for your child; starting with entry into the building with their attestation slips (also included), transitions, lunchtime, and end of day dismissal. Please read this document and review it with your child.

Return to Hybrid Safety Protocols

The safety of our students and staff is our number one priority!

Before School

- Parents check their student(s) for symptoms of Covid-19 each morning before school and fill out the blue health attestation slip to let us know that they are symptom free.
- All students and visitors will be required to wear a cloth face covering when in the building. A cloth face covering is anything that completely covers your mouth and nose, and fits securely on the sides of your face and under your chin. It should be made of two or more layers of tightly woven fabric with ties or straps that go around your head or behind your ears.

Bus Riding

- Drivers will keep students as far apart as possible while riding on the bus.
- Students from the same household will be allowed to sit together on the bus.
- All students will be required to wear a cloth face covering on the bus.

Arriving at School-Bus:

- Students will remain on their bus until they are dismissed, no earlier than 7:15 am.
- Those who have their blue attestation slips will go directly to the cafeteria for breakfast or to their first class immediately.
- Students who do not have a completed health attestation will be screened by a staff member before they can enter the building.
- All students will be required to wear a cloth face covering when entering the building. Masks will be given to students if needed.

Arriving at School-Parent Transportation or Drivers:

- The building will open for students at 7:15 am each morning.
- Parents driving their student will drop off in the drop-off loop and follow the signs.
- Drivers will park in the parking lot, and enter through the main doors of the building, with their attestation slip.
- If students arrive before 7:15 am, they will need to wait in their car, in the drop off line with their parent, or outside.
- Those who have their blue attestation slips will go directly to the cafeteria for breakfast or to their first class immediately.
- Students who do not have a completed health attestation will be screened by a staff member before they can enter the building.
- All students will be required to wear a cloth face covering when entering the building. Masks will be given to students if needed.

Breakfast:

- Students will eat breakfast in the commons. Students will wait in line using the floor markings, maintain social distancing, and pick up their breakfast.
- Students will remain in one seat. Seats will be spread out throughout the commons. When students finish breakfast they will go directly to their first class.

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Transitions between classes:

- Students will be expected to go directly from one class to the next, they will not be able to linger in the hallway, or the commons.
- Stanchions are in the hallways to keep the traffic to the right, and arrows on the floor for the direction.
- Students will be expected to follow social distancing guidelines.
- There will be limited use of restrooms during transition times due to capacity.

Late Arrival/Early Dismissal:

- Students arriving to campus after 7:35 am will check in at the main office.
- All parents/visitors must wear a cloth face covering on campus.
- Students that leave school early will be picked up by a parent or guardian.

In the Classroom:

- In preparation for returning students to the classroom safely, the air filtration system of each classroom and common area of the school was upgraded.
- Maximum capacity of each room was also calculated based on CDC recommendations and will be strictly adhered to.
- Students will sit in the assigned seat each day. Teachers will maintain an updated classroom seating chart for contact tracing needs.
- Students will sign out to use the restroom, one student out at a time. We will encourage students not to leave the first 10-15 minutes of class or the last 10-15 minutes of class.
- All desks will be arranged to maintain the required 6 feet of social distancing and to ensure that all students are facing in the same direction. When students are working in small groups, teachers will assign specific spots for them, ensuring that social distancing is always maintained.
- Books and other paper-based materials are not considered to be high risk for spreading the virus and will still be available for students in the classroom.
- Students will wash/sanitize their hands as they enter and exit the classroom and before and after use of materials.
- Students will sign out to use the restroom during class and use a hall pass.
- Staff will disinfect classroom surfaces during the end of the class period. Cleaning supplies are provided.

Lunch

- Students will wash their hands/use hand sanitizer before eating. Hand sanitizer stations located in classrooms and in the commons.
- Students will wait in line, using the floor markings to maintain social distancing, to pick up their lunches. There is no charge for food.
- All students will eat lunch in the commons. Students will not be allowed off campus for lunch and there will be no deliveries allowed on campus. They cannot go to their cars to eat lunch.

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- Students will self-select a seat at lunch, and will eat at that same seat daily for the remainder of the year unless safety protocol changes. Building will create a seating chart.
- Students will remain in their seats when eating.
- Students will use restrooms following the same guidelines as transitions.
- Students can take their masks off while eating, then will put them back on when finished and are allowed to turn and talk.
- They can go outside to the courtyard area after eating, maintaining social distancing and wearing their masks. If the safety guidelines are not followed, the courtyard will not be an option.
- Individual plans will be created for students who have food allergies under the direction of the school nurse.
- Three-day take-home meals will be available to all students each Tuesday and Friday.

Drinking Water

- All drinking fountains in our building will be unavailable. Students are encouraged to bring a water bottle from home and will be allowed to fill them up at the filling stations.

Using the Restroom

- Teachers will monitor sending one student at a time to the restroom. Hall passes will be hung up on hooks when entering the restroom as a visual cue for capacity.
- Spots will be marked for students to wait, socially distanced, if all facilities are in use.
- Students are asked to wash their hands when they finish using the restroom and will also be asked to use hand sanitizer when they re-enter the classroom.

Food and Drink in Classroom

- Drinks with lids are allowed. Students will need to replace their cloth face coverings immediately after drinking.
- Food is not allowed in the classroom.

Computer Use

- Teachers will disinfect computers/electronics between classes using proper cleaning supplies.

End of the Day-Bus riders:

- Students will be released by teachers and will go directly from classrooms to buses at 2:15 pm. If buses are not available when students are dismissed, they will wait, socially distanced, until they board their bus.
- Students will sit in their assigned seats and social distancing will be enforced. Cloth face coverings will be worn by all students as well as the driver.

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End of the Day-Parent pick up or drivers:

- Students will go directly from their classrooms to parent pickup or to the parking lot at 2:15 pm.
- If parents have not arrived when students are dismissed they will wait outside, socially distanced, until the parent arrives.

End of the Day-Extra-Curricular activities:

- Students who have extra-curricular activities after school will be released by teacher at 2:20 pm and will go straight to their location. This includes athletics, clubs, activities, teacher support, or after school support.

What if a student becomes sick at school?

- If a student starts to feel sick or if a teacher notices that a student shows symptoms of Covid during the school day, the teacher will contact the nurse.
- The nurse will escort the student out of the classroom and evaluate them for symptoms.
- If the nurse deems it necessary, the student will be moved into the quarantine room and will follow up with teacher if needed.
- Parents will be notified and asked to come pick up their child immediately. The quarantine room is a place for the student to rest while they wait for their parent.

What if a student is struggling to wear their cloth face covering?

- For the safety of all members of our learning community, cloth face covering must be worn at all times while at school, except when eating.
- We understand that cloth face coverings are new for students to wear for the entire day at school and it may be an adjustment for them.
- To that end, we will work with students to help them understand the importance of wearing cloth face coverings, give them reminders to keep them on, and problem solve with them around when it is acceptable to take their cloth face covering down.
- If not wearing a cloth face covering becomes an ongoing problem for a student, the same procedures will be followed as with other health and safety concerns in the classroom. Steps could include phone calls home, conversations between the student and the counselor or building administrator, and/or having the student move to a different location while practicing this expectation.
- If the problem persists, disciplinary consequences could be considered such as student pick up by parent.

Specialized PPE:

- Specialized PPE (such as for band students) will be provided at each building.

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Attendance:

- Attendance on Monday and Thursday will be taken for periods 1-3 for in person and remote students. Attendance on Tuesday and Friday will be taken for periods 4-6 for in person and remote students.
- Attendance will be taken for all students on Wednesday who are scheduled to attend based on the rotating schedule.
- It is essential that parents call to excuse all absences. Especially for students who miss their “in person” days.

Zoom check-in daily for students at home on A or B days: Beginning April 12th

- Students will zoom in from home on their asynchronous days at the beginning of class.
- Attendance will be taken, agenda will be shared, and any questions will be answered.
- Check in times will be:
 - 1st/4th at 7:40 am
 - 2nd/5th at 9:45 am
 - 3rd/6th at 12:25 pm
 - or other time to be determined by the teacher

Office hours on Wednesdays:

- All teachers will have office hours on Wednesdays from 11:45 am – 12:30 pm.

Emergency Drills:

- The district and building safety committees will confer to determine emergency drills.
